Exhausting State and Local Remedies for Limited Conservatorship Reform

The following state and local officials and agencies were contacted in 2014 and 2015 and asked to take action to help reform the limited conservatorship system in California. Despite our best efforts, no significant progress was made, except for the passage of AB1311 due to the leadership of Debra Bowen and her staff, as well as some encouragement from the staff at the public defender's office. As a result, we have turned to the United States Department of Justice to seek federal intervention.
