Dear Mr. Wade

We of the Louisville Gay Liberation Front are writing to you in behalf of Miss Tracy Knight and Miss Marjorie Jones, both women, who have filed here in Louisville for a marriage liscence.

Miss Knight and Miss Jones first applied for the liscence a week from last Monday, at which time the application for the liscence was taken but the liscence itself subsequently refused. The case is currently in legal process and going full speed ahead under the legal counsel of Attorneys Stewart Lyons and David Kaplan, Center Building, 522 W. Jefferson St., Louisville, Ky., 40208.

Since the time of the original application County Attorney Bruce Miller has attempted to remove Miss Jones' fourteen year old son from her custody on the grounds of contributing to the delinquency of a minor solely on the grounds that she is a professed homosexual.

Should you consider such an action appropriate, we would certainly appreciate your entering the case on an amicus curiae basis.
