Dear Arthur.

As you see, we have received another held mail form from the post office. I have written to IHWO and have suggested certain changes in the format of the address which will not make the inspectors as suspicious, but in any case, we want to continue to communicate with the homophile movement in Scandanavia. I have Xeroxed the card.

Yes, you have sent us a copy of the brief by ACLU for the Buchanan case, and thank you very much.

I have some ideas for a bar-community center-office in New York City which, I think, are worth relating. It is possible that the National Cooperatives (Co-op Supermarkets, etc.) could supply capital to a wax-TWEET bar incorporated as a co-op, with all profits going to community action projects to help the patrons indirectly. It would be, in fact and in effect, owned by the gay people of New York City. At the moment, nearly all of the New York bars are, or at least seem to be, owned by the Mafia or the Cosa Nostra. The managers and staff are usually gay (but quite dishonest) but the frare designed to make money, not to improve conditions for the homosexual patrons. Its worth mot while for the owners to make the patrons feel like criminals by not getting liquor licenses so that the bars can be raided. The owners are and feel like criminals, and it rubs off. I think that even such a straight middle class organization like the co-ops would sympathize with such a project.

We will talk further when I come to New York for Christopher St. Liberation Day. I will come to the Mattachine Office Sunday evening. if I do not see you during the day.

Enclosed is a copy of a held mail notice which we received today. It has already been signed by our advisor, but we have not yet sent it. The held letter most probably contains a copy of Viking magazine, sent to us by International Homosexual World Organizations, DK 4633, Østervang, Denmark.

We are afraid that, whether or not we send in this eard, our communications with I.H.W.O. will be effectively cut off, as their regular publications all have photographs which could possibly be considered observe. If we send back the eard, the Post Office will probably just toss out the contents. Because of certain court rulings, however, it is most likely that such material can be sent through the mail. Can we get any injunction against the P.O. either to hold the mail indefinitely, or to deliver it? This probably has to be done quickly, or they will just go ahaid and throw it out.

We would like to thank you for sending us the decision in the Buchanan case. We wish you all the very best with this case.
