
To Whom It May Concern:

Dr. Arthur C. Warner's voluntary work and assistance on behalf of the Sexual Law Reporter are too numerous to record in detail. He has worked actively for the Reporter at his own expense since it was established. During 1976 and 1977 his work was directed particularly to fund-raising and to negotiations with potential printers and publishers, but it was not limited to these areas. In this connection, his attendance at the following meetings and conferences during 1976 was indispensable:

1. Advocate meeting, Chicago, Illinois in March.
2. Annual meeting of the Reporter in Los Angeles, late June to early July.
3. C.B.C. meeting in Atlanta, Georgia in August.
4. Meetings, conferences & negotiations in Columbus & Cleveland, Ohio, Chicago, Illinois & Indianapolis, Indiana during November & December.

To suggest, however, that Dr. Warner's work for the Reporter was limited to these meetings and conferences would convey a rather distorted view of his work, which is more like that of a regular, part-time staff-member who would ordinarily be compensated for his efforts were he working for any commercial enterprise. To mention only some of the things which he accomplished for the Reporter in 1976, due to his efforts in that year, culminated by his negotiations at the C.B.C. meeting in Atlanta instanced above, funding for a major part of the Reporter's operations was obtained. Because the Reporter is printed and published entirely by non-salaried, voluntary personnel, these operations have never been performed in an efficient and business-like manner. Dr. Warner worked during 1976 -- and again during 1977 -- to set up arrangements with regular printers and publishers so that the Reporter's problems in this connection could, hopefully, be solved. Also during 1976 Dr. Warner assisted in arranging for research projects by law students at various law schools for the purpose of researching material for eventual publication in the Reporter. It is obvious from the above that Dr. Warner's work for the Reporter was in no way limited to his attendance at the formal meetings and conferences listed above. I can simply state that there have been numerous other trips which he, by necessity, has made for the Reporter, such as to Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, to represent us on the Governor of Pennsylvania's Council on Sexual Minorities, to New York for meetings of the Academic Union in addition to his discussions there with possible printers and publishers, and to Philadelphia and Washington for other purposes.

This should explain in some brief measure the nature and scope of the work which Dr. Warner carries out for the Sexual Law Reporter, and for which all of us are so very grateful.
