National Committee for Sexual Civil Liberties
Statement of Goals and Purposes - approved by the
Committee on November 3, 1979

The National Committee for Sexual Civil Liberties is a private, non-profit organization dedicated to the pursuit of sexual civil liberties through administrative, legislative, judicial, and educational means. The Committee consists of a select group of men and women chosen for their expertise in scholarship, research, and various practical disciplines impinging on the areas of the Committee's concern, as well as for their dedication to the goal of full sexual rights.

In recognition of the wide area of government involvement in social and economic life today, the Committee works to secure equal sexual rights wherever such involvement occurs. In its quest for preservation of individual freedom in sexual matters, the Committee's current concentration on issues touching upon sexual orientation reflects the Committee's origins. It is nevertheless the Committee's firm belief that sexual civil liberties issues are not separable or independent from one another, and the Committee therefore affirms its commitment to the pursuit of sexual liberty in all its aspects.

Through its members and its distinguished Board of Consultants, the Committee strives to gather together those whose achievements, aptitudes and temperaments might prove to be a valuable resource in the effort to pursue sexual civil liberties. The constant searching evaluation of proposed new members from diverse fields of expertise and various localities enables the Committee to renew its commitment to excellence and to pursue its objective of re-enforcing its national character, for it is the Committee's belief that a truly national organization is best able to address the profound implications of the struggle to protect sexual civil liberties.
