Just when I thought I had the whole game in New York City down pat—even started feeling like a master at love, I moved to "LA-I and."



My Relationshop Experience (July, N.Y.)

Getting off trying to write this, brings me here to its inevitable writing. To write of some intellectual hodge-podge would be such an easy task right about now. It de-

mands only my mind; I could write for hours and say all the correct words. And be right about it all too.

Something as simple as, "write me of your experience" has become the most demanding, most complex, most frustrating, annoying and hardest task I have ever undertaken. Until right now..

Owning up to my fears about this (it'll be awful. I want to be a poet and a writer... garble...garble...) and wants (tell me it's great, c'mon please), I came to my bottom

"Oh shit, I'm not my mind. It's time to grow and come from the truth. No, there's nowhere to hide. Be yourself, come from yourself, write of yourself."

There was also a hint (a big one) of "Well he's gonna be there and so I best show up!" He, being the man I share lots of space and love with and with whom that very same week began to lose sight and touch with. Lonely, scared, excited, scared, nervous and more scared, I entered the physical space of the workshop.

Within 21/2 days and 4 walls I experienced an eon of time and a space of forever. It was higher than my wildest fantasies and lower than my darkest nightmares.

I cried - as I hurt all over and cried as I felt despair and loss.

Recreations of pains and hurts I caused and effected from.

Cried as I got and gave incredible love I have and am - no matter what.

Cried as I got that everything is simple; coming from the truth - it just is.

That I was a terrible liar and through the lies my life was one problem after another.

And the tears weren't a little girl being coy or anything. They were real; they came from the truth; they came from me and

were a part of me. And so was the pain, and the anger, and the boredom, and the sleepiness and the hurt and the fear and the desires and the wants. It was all me - about me, from me, mine....created by me, felt by me, experienced by me ... all mine.

And so they were mine to play with, and inevitably choose to let go of or keep (hadn't I already chosen?).

Letting go was surrounded by so so much...

"Here I am". I was saying. "me, a woman; yeah - no shit - I really am. " It was such a surprise to find her hiding out under all that. And the surprise was mine and mine alone.

I feel such love for those who supported me - who were there. Your names are insignificant as I hold you close to my heart and pour out love for you.


-And for all those I lied to? now face the truth - there is only abounding love.

The Growth and Communication Program
