Education: A.B. Princeton Univ. (high honors), 1938. LL.B. Harvard Law School, 1946 as of 1942. Ph.D. Harvard Univ. (American & British history), 1960.

Positions: Ensign-Lieutenant, U.S. Navy, 1942-1945. Field representative, American Association for the United Nations, 1946-48. Research assistant, London School of Economics, 1954-1956. Assistant professor history, Rider College, Lawrenceville, N.J., 1956-60. Lecturer Fairleigh Dickinson Univ., Rutherford, N.J., 1960-62. Associate professor University of Texas 1962-68. Founder in 1971, and since then director, National Committee for Sexual Civil Liberties, later renamed the American Association for Personal Privacy.

Legal & political activities: Founding member in 1952 of the Mattachine Society of New York. Subsequently chairman of its legal committee for all but two of its 16-year existence.
